Derby High School operates its own Fees in Advance Scheme for the payment of school fees for future years. The percentage of savings is dependent on the interest rates at the time of payment. It is important that the Bursar's Department is made aware if you wish to take advantage of this deduction by 9.00 am on the first day of the second half of the Summer Term. Fees can also be paid by Flexiffee arrangements. When three or more siblings attend the school, there is a reduction of 33¹/₃% on the above tuition fees for the youngest child.

The Governing Body reserves the right to revise the fee structure further should circumstances prove necessary. School fees are payable termly in advance. Extras are charged retrospectively. The basic school fee includes tuition, most books, stationery, lunch and a snack at break. Typical extras include exam fees, individual instrumental lessons, individual lessons for pupils with learning difficulties or English language support. School trips, photographs and miscellaneous other items are also charged as extras. These are either itemised on the school bill or charged directly by the person supplying the service.

Parental consent is normally sought for a child to take part in a chargeable activity.

PRIMARY EXTRA TIME

The after school club for our Primary children is called Primary Extra Time and runs from 3:30pm to 5:30pm daily. The cost is **£6.50 per hour** payable monthly. Children attending Primary Extra Time are collected from their classrooms at 3.30pm and taken to the Nightingale classroom in the Infant building where they have a snack and take part in various activities – arts & crafts, homework, games both indoors and outdoors, weather permitting. On Tuesdays and Wednesdays, which are long days in the Senior School, we offer late waiting for no charge until 4pm for Junior pupils who have siblings in the Senior School so that only one pick-up is required.

LATE WAITING IN THE SENIOR SCHOOL

The Senior School offers a free facility for late waiting whereby pupils are permitted to stay in the library, on the tennis courts or on the Head's lawn (weather permitting) until 5.30pm. Late Waiting is supervised by our Sixth Formers alongside administrative staff.

SCHOLARSHIPS

PRIMARY DEPARTMENT

Scholarships are not awarded to pupils in the Primary Department.

YEAR 7

- Any remission will apply only to the basic school fee, not to any extras.
- Scholarships awarded to girls entering Year 7 are valid until the end of Year 11, at which point girls can apply for the full range of Sixth Form Scholarships and awards.
- Suitability for the award of an Academic Scholarship in Year 7 will be assessed by a separate Scholarship paper taken on Entrance Exam day by all Scholarship applicants both internal and external. General performance in the rest of the Entrance Exam for external pupils and from internal assessments for Derby High School pupils will also be taken into consideration.
- Music Scholarships may be awarded in Year 7. They will be awarded to girls showing outstanding musical potential. Girls wishing to be considered for a Music Scholarship in Year 7 are likely to have reached Grade 3 on at least one instrument. A limited number of Scholarships are also available for Sport, Drama, Art and Design.
- Headteacher's Scholarships may be awarded to girls entering Year 7 who perform well in the Entrance Exam and whose interests, achievements and reference from their school indicates that they are likely to make a significant contribution to the broader life of the school.

SIXTH FORM

- Subject specific Academic Scholarships are available for girls entering the Lower Sixth. They are assessed by examination. In addition to this, a few candidates are selected for further interview to be considered for a Major Academic Scholarship linked to two subjects. The Headteacher has the discretion to award a Headteacher's Scholarship to a student entering the Sixth Form whose GCSE results suggest outstanding academic potential.
- Music Awards may be made to girls entering the Lower Sixth. Girls must demonstrate a high level of musical ability and commitment

to school music. They should have reached at least Grade 6 on their chosen instrument. Music Awards do not require study of A level Music but Academic Music Scholarships do.

- Sports Awards may be made to girls entering the Lower Sixth. Girls wishing to be considered should be of County standard in at least one recognised school sport. They will be expected to have shown evidence of commitment to sporting activities throughout their school life. Evidence of a commitment to assisting with the coaching of younger children will be an advantage. Sports Awards do not require participation in A level PE but Academic PE Scholarships do.
- Drama Award applicants should be able to demonstrate a talent for acting or be a key member of a backstage/lighting team. Drama Awards do not require participation in A level Art & Design but Art & Design Scholarships do.
- Art & Design Award applicants should have a comprehensive portfolio of work completed both inside and outside school. Art and Design Awards do not require participation in A level Art & Design but Art & Design Scholarships do.
- All Rounder Awards may be made to girls entering the Lower Sixth. These will be made to girls who have not received any other award, but who are likely to make a significant contribution to the overall life of the school.

All Scholarships will be between £1,000 and a maximum of £2,500. No combination of awards will exceed 50% of full fees.

Any remission will apply only to the basic school fee, not to any extras.

ASSISTED PLACES

Assisted Places are available to pupils who would otherwise not be able to benefit from the education offered at Derby High School. The maximum value of an Assisted Place is 50% of the basic school fee. This remission does not apply to extras.

Parents applying for an Assisted Place will be required to declare details of income and investments, using the standard form supplied by the Bursar. The level of the award will be decided by the Headteacher, with advice from the Bursar, based on the information supplied. The Bursar may request to see parents applying for Assisted Places should any clarification be required of information supplied.

Pupils benefiting from an Assisted Place will be expected to be fully committed to the ethos of the school and to play a full part in the life of the school. Their assessment, reports and conduct will be expected to reflect their commitment to their studies.

Parents of pupils receiving Assisted Places will be expected to inform the school of changes in their financial situation.

Assisted Places are reviewed annually and are not guaranteed to remain the same year on year.

LEARNING DIFFICULTIES

The school will do all that is reasonable in the case of each pupil to detect and deal appropriately with a learning difficulty or disability which amounts to a special educational need. Pupils new to the school are screened shortly after their arrival. If we have concerns that a child might have a learning difficulty, these will be discussed with parents in order to decide the best course of action.

As our staff are not qualified to make a diagnosis of conditions such as dyslexia or dyspraxia, the school can provide the name of an educational psychologist who can administer a detailed assessment and details of costs are available on request. The school has a visiting specialist teacher who can provide individual learning support. These lessons are invoiced separately by the teacher and a rota system operates so pupils do not regularly miss the same lesson.

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE

In Primary, tuition for children for whom English is not their first language is available from a qualified specialist EAL teacher. These lessons are charged as extras.

INSTRUMENTAL LESSONS

Music is part of the curriculum from pre-school onwards. All children have the opportunity to learn the recorder in Years 3 and 4.

Year 3 are given 'taster' workshops on woodwind, brass and string instruments in the Autumn Term and have the opportunity to receive tuition and free instrument loan from the Spring Term. Individual tuition is also available on piano and electric keyboard from Year 2 and guitar from Year 4.

Individual music lessons are invoiced separately by the instrumental teachers and one term's written notice is required if a pupil wishes to discontinue lessons. Pupils below Year 10 will normally have their instrumental tuition during the school timetable, but a rota system operates so they do not regularly miss the same lesson. Fixed instrumental lessons outside the school timetable are reserved for pupils from Year 10 upwards.
