I have a concern, about myself or someone I know. What do I do?

Firstly, don't keep it to yourself. You do not need to deal with this alone. You can talk to any member of staff, email us, or use the 'report a serious concern' button on the intranet.

I want to talk to someone about a safeguarding concern but I don't want my parents to know about it.

This is a common concern; you are not alone. We cannot keep a situation confidential if your safety is at risk. However, we will always work with you through the process throughout and support you as best we can.

I am worried about my friend who is unsafe, but I don't want to break their trust.

It is true that they may find it hard. However, we find usually friends do understand that you have acted out of concern for them and realise you've done the right thing.
